ELIASVILLE, TEXAS

Young County FM-1974 at FM-701

Known as one of the most picturesque ghost towns of Texas. Eliasville sets on the Clear Fork of the Brazos River in Young County. Settled in the 1870s close to the J.L. Dobbs ranch. It hosts a stone dam and gristmill. Known for mineral extraction and petroleum exploration. It was surrounded by refineries and carbon black plants and served by the Wichita Falls and Southern Railway. At one time the town boasted a population of 1500 residents. Eliasville declined during WW II. Today about 100 residents make Eliasville home.
